Exhibition Description:

The First Metal is the first exhibition to focus on copper metalwork in the Arts and Crafts movement in the United Kingdom and the United States, with additional works from Germany, Ireland, Australia, and New Zealand. Drawing on the JSMA's Margo Grant Walsh Twentieth Century Silver and Metalwork Collection and a number of private and museum loans, the exhibition presents a range of hand-wrought copper works by many of the premier Arts and Crafts metalsmiths working in late 19th and early 20th century. The lavishly illustrated exhibition catalogue includes newly commissioned essays by Arts and Crafts scholar-curators Mary Greensted and Jonathan Clancy.
